**HEARTWORM (HW) AND FLEA In CATS-**

We carry ONE preventative products:

1. **FELINE ADVANTAGE MULTI-** once monthly topical application that prevents heartworm, kills fleas, and treats and controls, hookworm, roundworm and earmites. Kittens can start at 2 LBS or at LEAST 9 weeks of age.

## KITTEN AND CAT VACCINATION PROTOCOL:

Start at 6 weeks of age- FVRCCP #1- First kitten “Distemper” shot

O brings FECAL sample

Dewormer- liquid dewormer given at each kitten visit does NOT kill tapeworms so, fecal analysis is usually required.

~10 weeks of age-

FVRCCP #2 kitten shot:

O brings FECAL sample

Dewormer

We also strongly recommend testing against FELV/FIV/HW on this visit. It is fast and accurate blood test that requires only a few drops of blood.

Outdoor Cats should then be vaccinated against FELV/FIV if NEG on tests to prevent spread of these diseases and protect against feral cats with these diseases.

~14 weeks of age-

FVRCCP #3 kitten shot:

O brings FECAL sample

Dewormer

RABIES vaccine

Outdoor Cats: booster to FELV/FIV vaccine.

~18 weeks of age-

Outdoor Cats: Last FIV booster.

Schedule according to age....Vaccines are given every 3-4 weeks until complete.

## ADULT VACCINATION PROTOCOL:

Indoor Cats- FVRCCP every 2 years  
Rabies every year

Outdoor Cats- FVRCCP every 2 years  
Rabies every year  
FELV- every 2 years  
FIV- every year

\*\*\*Adult cats that have never had a FVRCCP vaccine will need a series of TWO vaccines given 4 weeks apart.

“YEARLY” will include doctor examination, shots, fecal, biohazard fee.
